## Special Olympics Arkansas Announces Law Enforcement Torch Run Hall of Fame with its first inductee

**11/13/17**— Little Rock, AR Special Olympics Arkansas presented its first Hall of Fame inductee Tuesday night (11/7/17) at the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Law Enforcement Torch Run Banquet. The evening showcased some of the best memories and the impact that the Torch Run has had on not only Special Olympics Arkansas but on the state as a whole.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics has raised over 7.2 million dollars over the past 30 years that allows the over 15,000 athletes in Arkansas to participate in the over 240 sports competitions that take place every year.

What started as a 30 mile run in 1987 has become a 1200 mile run that starts in the Four Corners of the state and is completed with the lighting of the torch that opens Special Olympics Arkansas Summer Games. Outside of running the Flame of Hope into competitions Officers participate in year-round fundraisers such as; polar plunge and tip a cop all to generate funds and awareness for Special Olympics athletes.

The Hall of Fame's first inductee, Bill Buford was instrumental in bringing the Torch Run to Arkansas. He served as State Director for seventeen years, and was active in bringing many of today's officers to Special Olympics Arkansas. He has always led by example and is still dedicated to the success and growth of Law Enforcement Torch Run. He has proudly served Law Enforcement Torch Run globally on the International Executive Council and has represented Arkansas well for the last 30 years.
